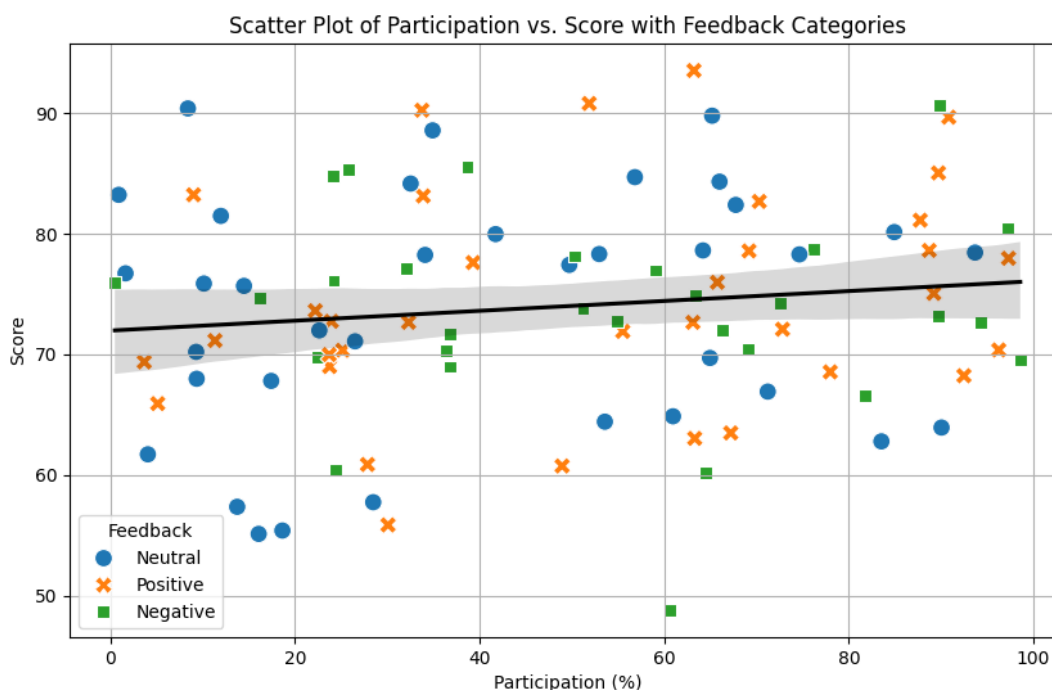


Figure 1 Scatter Plot of Participation vs. Score with Feedback Categories

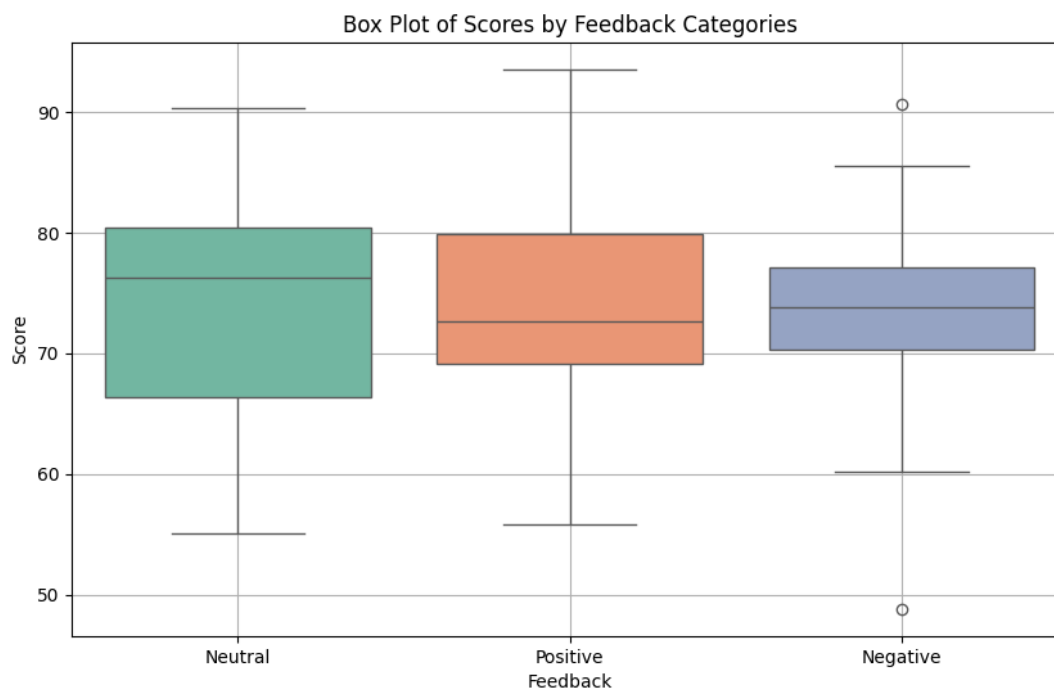


Figure 2 Box Plot of Scores by Feedback Categories
