3. Study Value and Concept Definition of Body Language

3.1 Definition of Body Language

With the advent of the economic globalization era, China's market economy has developed rapidly, during which period, China has strengthened its cooperation with overseas countries, so the intercultural communication and etiquette have also become an indispensable part of diplomacy. The meaning of intercultural communication can be defined within the scope of linguistic behavior that the communicators in different cultural backgrounds use the same language to communicate in a specific cultural communication environment, apart from that, it also includes another form of communication, namely non-verbal communication, also known as body language communication, which includes not only communication through verbal behaviors, but also other body language such as kissing, shaking hands and hugging³.

In the book *Intercultural Nonverbal Communication*, Hu Wenzhong and Bi Jiwan divide nonverbal communication into four parts: body language, paralanguage, object language and environment language⁴. Relevant documents show that body language communication accounts for 70% of the whole communication process. Verbal communication focuses on the transmission of ideas, while non-verbal communication usually reflects external manifestations, therefore, for the intercultural communication, attention should be paid to the expression of language as well as the understanding of cultural customs and other knowledge. The language communication reflects human consciousness and subjective control, while the body language mostly reflects the display of subconscious behavior.

3.3 Role of Body Language Communication

With the mutual promotion and continuous development of modern economy and culture, the scientific and reasonable use of etiquette in intercultural communication can effectively improve the civilization accomplishment of both parties, improve the relationship between communication parties, and thus promote the harmonious development of the whole society, therefore, the application of body language in intercultural etiquette attracts more and more attention from the society. Nonverbal communication also has very extensive ways and it becomes an important means of intercultural communication. For the intercultural communication, if we can make a corresponding culture-acceptable physical contact or behavior according to the different social culture attribute, the embarrassment and conflict in communication can be effectively avoided and also it will be easy to understand and respect the culture, finally, better promote the smooth progress of intercultural communication.

4. Role of Body Language in Intercultural Communication Etiquette

4.1 Emotional Metaphor

Under the guidance of Socrates, Gorgia concludes that 'Persuasion is the whole and essence of rhetoric'. Aristotle, on the other hand, says, 'The object of rhetoric is to present persuasive facts in any case, not to persuade.' and he holds that 'persuasion is the ability to find persuasive methods available in any given fact'. Therefore, the rational use of appropriate body language can help people metaphor their inner feelings, make language and behavior complement each other, and make the two parties' thoughts and words to be expressed in the communication process be well displayed. Body language can not only convey people's subjective consciousness, real-time thoughts and emotions to the other party, but also understand the psychological dynamic changes of both parties in the communication process through the feedback of the other party's body language. Therefore, body language is a two-way transmission and communication way⁵.

4.2 Communication Alternative

According to relevant research, in human communication, most people pay attention to each

other's eyes, and then pay attention to each other's ears, thus, in the process of intercultural communication, the body language plays a crucial role in intercultural communication. Leonardo Da Vinci says, 'Everyman is blind, deaf, acts without thinking, and even speaks without thinking.' Therefore, in the process of cross-cultural communication, it is necessary to attract the attention of the other party in order to better express their own views. In the process of information transmission, body language spreads faster and more widely than verbal behaviors. When verbal behaviors cannot well express communicative content, people generally prefer to use body language to express, that is, to use body language to convey content. Therefore, the importance of body language to intercultural communication is self-evident.

4.3 Supplementary Reinforcement

Body language can only use facial expressions, actions and other body behavior to convey information, but also can assist language behavior to strengthen emotion. In terms of expressing feeling and emotion, it is hardly comparable for verbal expression to body language. The verbal behavior may say what one doesn't think, but body language is the expression of people's real feeling and emotion subconsciously. Liu Zongyuan, a Chinese literati in tang Dynasty says that 'Intellectuals take virtue cultivation as the foundation, of which sincerity is the most important.' He holds that people with knowledge should first cultivate their own virtue, from which we can know that body language, as an important channel to show human's conduct, can support expression and amplify people's thoughts and intentions.

5. Important Significance of Body Language Communication Etiquette in Intercultural Communication

5.1 Make the Communication Etiquette Norms Explicit, Promote Cultural Communication

As the intercultural communication is conducted between two parties under different cultural backgrounds, some problems of cultural differences and personality differences often appear, which will also lead to etiquette differences in the process of intercultural communication. And these differences may affect the normal communication between intercultural communicators, thus form communication barriers and cause differences in opinion. Before cross-cultural communication, the understanding of the body language communication etiquette of the other culture can not only make the communication between people under different cultural backgrounds smooth, but also reduce the probability of the occurrence of differences in opinion, further guarantee the harmony and smooth of intercultural communication, and reflect the standardization of communication etiquette and behavior.

5.2 Effective Delivery of Information, Reflection of Cultural Communication Connotation

Nonverbal cultural communication behavior, namely, body language communication behavior, can effectively realize the delivery of information, and then clearly express the meaning of the specific content that communicators want to express, furthermore, in which process the expression of related emotions can also be strengthened. In the process of intercultural body language communication, not only the behavior between the two parties can be reflected, but also the emotional expression can also be reflected, besides, a series of body movements can not only express the subjective emotion attitude in time, also assist in the information delivery, finally strengthen the conversation understanding. In addition, under different cultural backgrounds, the differences in intercultural communication situation language and etiquette also reflect the cultural differences and connotations of different countries.

6. Conclusion

To sum up, the application scope of body language communication is relatively extensive. In order to strengthen international cooperation and communication, it is necessary to actively apply body language in intercultural etiquette communication. In this paper, it adopts the methods of
